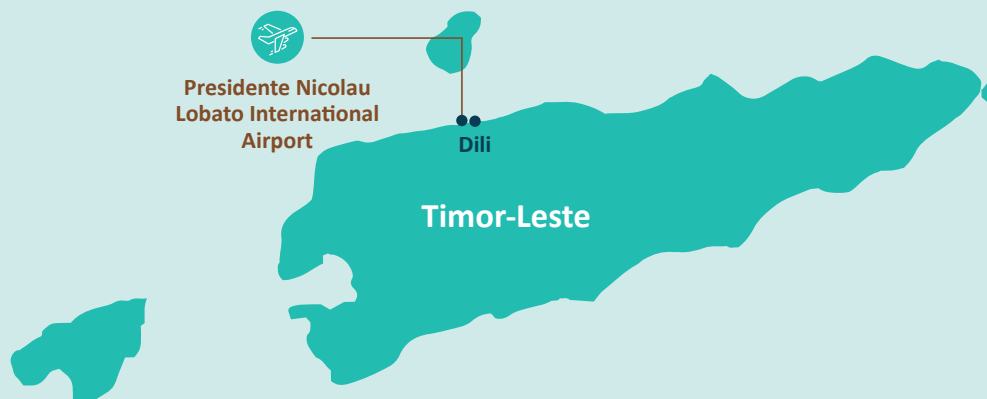

About the project

Australia, through the Australian Infrastructure Financing Facility for the Pacific (AIFFP), has provided a loan and grant package to the Government of Timor-Leste to upgrade a range of operational and public-facing ground facilities at its main international airport. With the airport a main international gateway and key to driving further economic opportunities for Timor-Leste, the upgrades will facilitate increased tourism flows by expanding passenger capacity and improving customer experience.

Additionally, the works will support the airport to meet critical international safety and security standards and expand its capabilities to include cargo handling and quarantine facilities. The project is also supported by a bilateral grant of AUD7.9 million via the Australian Government's Partnerships for Infrastructure program. Australia's investment complements additional work being undertaken at the airport by the Asian Development Bank and the Japan International Cooperation Agency.

Impact at a glance

Across all its projects, the AIFFP prioritises lasting development and economic outcomes for people and communities. Its approach is guided by five impact areas: local content; climate resilience; social and environmental safeguards; gender equality, disability and social inclusion; and quality and integrity.

The project aims to increase economic opportunities and connectivity with the region, through support for the airport's international traffic operations, safety and security compliance.

LOCAL CONTENT



It is expected the project will **create local 280 jobs** during the construction phase, with further local employment and economic growth in the **local tourism industry** through the airport's increased capacity.

The redevelopment will deliver new facilities to **improve capability for cargo and quarantine management**, which will provide long-term growth opportunities for Timor-Leste's important agricultural sector, particularly the live fisheries industry.

SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL SAFEGUARDS

The works will **improve transportation options and safety in and around the airport for women and people with disabilities**, with measures including **widening of footpaths and gradient adjustments on pathways**. This work will be undertaken in collaboration with the Disabilities Association of Timor-Leste.



GENDER EQUALITY, DISABILITY AND SOCIAL INCLUSION

Airport facilities, including off-airport components, will include **gender-sensitive and disability-inclusive design features**.

To support staff and contractors working on the project, **training will be delivered on gender-based violence and the prevention of sexual exploitation, abuse and harassment**. The project will also **strengthen the gender capacity** of Air Navigation Administration of Timor-Leste, Civil Aviation Authority of Timor-Leste and the Ministry of Transport and Communications by supporting the creation of an **inclusive human resources development plan**.
